

make out and deliver to the town clerk of said town, a true list of all personal property in said town that was listed and not entered upon the assessment roll of said town, for the year 1863.

Computation of taxes.

SECTION 2. The town clerk of said town shall, upon the receipt of such list, compute the tax or taxes in the aggregate upon such personal property, the same as was computed on other personal property in said town for the said year 1863, and when so computed, the said town clerk shall deliver the same to the town treasurer of said town, with a warrant attached, directing said treasurer to collect the said tax or taxes on or before the first day of April next.

Disbursement of taxes.

SECTION 3. The tax or taxes, when so collected, shall be disbursed by the town board of supervisors of said town as they may deem best for the benefit of said town.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 103.

[Published March 5, 1864.]

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter two hundred and seventy-eight of the general laws of 1863, entitled "an act to vacate the village plat of Pittsburg, located on the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of fractional section thirty-six, in town nine, range two west, and to provide for the sale of the same."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Plat vacated.

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and seventy-eight of the general laws of 1863, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "Section 1. The plat of the village of Pittsburg, laid out and platted by the commissioners of school and university lands, in the year 1849, upon lot three, or the east half of the southwest quarter of fractional section number thirty-six, town nine, of range two west, (*be and the same*) is hereby vacated."

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 104.

[Published March 5, 1864.]

AN ACT to authorize the common council of the city of Sheboygan to levy an additional amount of tax for the year 1864, to purchase a fire-engine.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Sheboygan is hereby authorized and empowered to levy upon the real and personal taxable property of the said city, for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, a tax in addition to the amount of tax which said common council is now authorized by law to levy, not exceeding two thousand dollars, for the purpose of purchasing a fire-engine, and all necessary hose and apparatus, for the use of said city. Additional tax for engine, &c.

SECTION 2. Said additional tax shall be levied, assessed and collected at the same time and in the same manner as, and shall be included in and shall form a part of the tax which shall be levied, assessed and collected for general city purposes for said year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four. Levy and collection of tax.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
