

required by law to be levied and collected; and if said officers shall have collected or shall have proceeded to collect said tax in the manner directed by this act, the same shall be and is hereby declared legal.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 155.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of James S. Murphy, as justice of the peace of the town of Center, La Fayette county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All the official acts performed by James S. Murphy, as justice of the peace in the town of Center, La Fayette county, in this state, during the year 1863, so far as the same are consistent with the general laws of this state, are hereby legalized and declared to be as valid and binding in law, to all intents and purposes, the same as though the said James S. Murphy had been eligible to the office of justice of the peace during said year. Acts legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
