CHAPTER 314.

[Published April 20, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize a special town meeting held in the town of Forest, Fond du Lac county, for the purpose of raising money, by tax, to pay volunteers who may enlist in the military service of the United States, from the said town of Forest.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Meeting and tax
legalized.

SECTION 1. The special town meeting held in the town of Forest, Fond du Lac county, Wisconsin, on the 7th day of March, 1864, for the purpose of raising money, by tax, to pay volunteers who might thereafter enlist in the military service of the United States, as stated in the notice for said meeting, and also the tax roll subsequently made out and delivered to the treasurer of said town, are hereby declared to be legal and valid for all purposes whatsoever.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 315.

[Published April 20, 1864.]

AN ACT to provide for the indexing and transcribing the journals of the senate and assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation
for transcribing.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Frank M. Stewart, chief clerk of the senate, for indexing the

senate journal, the sum of one hundred dollars, and for completing the transcribing of the senate journal, the sum of one hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to John S. Dean, chief clerk of the assembly, for indexing the assembly journal, the sum of one hundred dollars, and for completing the transcribing of the assembly journal, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars.

Appropriation for indexing.

SECTION 3. No money hereby appropriated shall be drawn from the treasury, until the secretary of state shall certify that the duties herein provided for shall have been, respectively, performed.

When money to be draw.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 316.

[Published April 21, 1864.]

AN ACT to provide seals to be furnished for the use of registers of deeds.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The board of supervisors of each county in this state is hereby required, as soon as practicable after the passage of this act, to provide and furnish a seal for the office of register of deeds, with such inscription and devices as shall be appropriate, in each of the respective counties.

Seals to be furnished registers of deeds.

SECTION 2. The register of deeds in each of the several counties of this state, is hereby authorized to adopt and use such seals as provided for by section one of this act, and the affixing of such seal to any certificate of record or attestation issuing from said office, shall be deemed a sufficient authentication thereof to make it testimony in any court of this state.

Seal sufficient authentication of certificates.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
