CHAPTER 333.

[Published April 21, 1864.]

AN ACT to revive and continue in force the charter of the Ashland and Iron Mountain railroad company.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter one hundred and sixty of the private and local laws of 1859, entitled "an act to incorporate the Ashland and Iron Mountain railroad company," is hereby revived, and shall remain and continue in force for and during the term of ten years from and after the 17th day of March, 1863, and the franchises, privileges and immunities thereby granted to said railroad company, are hereby confirmed. Time extended ten years.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 337.

[Published April 21, 1864.]

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Milwaukee mechanics' mutual insurance company," approved February 18, 1852.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The next annual election of directors of the Milwaukee mechanics' mutual insurance company, Annual elections

shall be held on the third Monday of January, A. D. 1865, and thereafter such election shall be held on the third Monday of January, in each year. The officers of the said company now in office, shall continue to hold their respective offices until their successors shall be chosen and qualified, on the third Monday of January, 1865, unless sooner removed according to law. The directors of said company now in office, whose terms of office would expire on the first Monday of October, in any year, shall be and remain directors of the said company until their successors shall be elected and qualified, at the annual election in this act provided to be held next after the time when their term of office would otherwise expire.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 344.

[Published April 20, 1864.]

AN ACT to incorporate the La Crosse medical college.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Corporators.

SECTION 1. Dugald D. Cameron, P. S. McArthur, John B. G. Baxter, William L. Kennett, Ewen H. McMillen, William T. Wenzell and Augustus Brummell, and the president of the collegiate faculty for the time being, and their successors, shall be and they are hereby created a body politic and corporate, to be styled and called the "board of trustees of the La Crosse medical college," to remain in perpetual succession, the design and purpose of said corporation being and the same is hereby declared to be to found, establish and maintain at La Crosse, in the county of La Crosse, an institution of medical and surgical education of the highest order.

SECTION 2. There shall be seven trustees of said corporation, and when a collegiate faculty shall have been duly chosen and organized, as hereinafter provi-
