## CHAPTER 350.

Published May 9, 1865.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to amend and consolidate an act entitled 'an act to incorporate the city of Racine,' approved August 8th, 1848, and the several acts amendatory thereof," approved March 22d, 1861.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Annual tax of \$1,000 for school purposes.

SECTION 1. In addition to the annual tax of nine thousand dollars, authorized by subdivision one of section thirty-six of the act of which this is amendatory, to be annually levied for school purposes by the city council of the city of Racine, said city council may annually levy a tax of one thousand dollars, to be expended in necessary repairs of school houses in said city, and of fixtures and heating apparatus belonging thereto.

Transfer of \$3,-000 to school fond.

SECTION 2. The city treasurer of said city of Racine is hereby authorized and empowered to transfer or cause to be transferred to the credit of the "school fund" of said city, for the school year ending July 8d, 1865, three thousand dollars of the moneys now in his hands, realized upon tax certificates issued upon sales

and disbursed.

of property for taxes in said city in the years 1856, Now to be held 1857, 1858, 1859 and 1860; and said amount of said moneys shall upon such transfer belong to said "school fund," and shall be held by said city treasurer subject to the order of the president and clerk of the board of education of said city, and shall be disbursed and expended for school purposes in said city for said year ending July 3d, 1865, in addition to the amount authorised by the act of which this is amendatory, to be

expended for such purposes in said year.

SECTION 3. The city treasurer of said city of Racine Transfer of \$1, is hereby further authorized and empowered to transfer or cause to be transferred to the credit of the "poor fund" of said city, for the present fiscal year, one thousand dollars of the moneys now in his hands, realized upon the tax certificates mentioned in section two How to be disof this act; and said amount of said moneys shall upon bursed. such transfer, belong to said "poor fund," and shall be disbursed and expended for the support of the poor of said city for the present fiscal year, in addition to the amount authorized by the act of which this is amendatory, to be expended for such purposes in said year.

SECTION 4. The city treasurer of said city of Racine Transfer of \$1. is hereby further authorized and empowered to cause fund. to be transferred to the credit of the "contingent fund" of said city, for the present fiscal year, one thousand dollars of the moneys now in his hands, realized upon the tax certificates mentioned in section two of this act; and said amount of said moneys shall upon such trans- How to be disfer, belong to said "contingent fund," and shall the disbursed and expended as part of said fund during the present fiscal year, in addition to the amount authorized by the act of which this is amendatory, to be so expended in said year.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
