

have furnished substitutes which [who] have been accepted into the United States service, and been credited on the quota of said town, in such way and manner as was directed by vote of the citizens of said town at a special meeting held on the 10th day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

SECTION 2. That the said supervisors shall draw their orders on the treasurer of said town, in behalf of said families, respectively, and for such amounts, severally, as were directed by the citizens at said special town meeting; and it is hereby made the duty of said treasurer to pay such orders on presentation, out of the moneys in his hands so levied and collected by special tax as aforesaid. Payment of moneys appropriated.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage:

CHAPTER 4.

[Published January 27, 1865.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of a special town meeting held on the seventh day of January, A. D. 1865, in the town of Pulaski, Iowa county, Wisconsin, and authorizing the collection, forthwith, of the tax voted at such meeting.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The special town meeting of the town of Pulaski, in Iowa county, held on the seventh day of January, A. D. 1865, for the purpose of raising a special tax to pay bounties to volunteers into the military service of the United States, is hereby declared legal and valid for all the intents and purposes for which the same was held; and all acts done in pursuance of the vote or votes of said meeting, by the officers of said town, or any of them, are hereby declared valid, the same as if the law had been fully complied with in conducting said meeting. Meeting legalized.

SECTION 2. All acts of the officers of said town, or either of them, in proceeding to the immediate collection of said tax, are hereby legalized and declared valid. Acts of officers legalized.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 5.

[Published January 27, 1865.]

AN ACT to authorize the town of Lebanon, in Dodge county, to collect a tax to pay bounties to volunteers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Tax may be collected.

SECTION 1. The town officers of the town of Lebanon, in Dodge county, are hereby authorized to levy and collect upon the last assessment roll of said town, the amount of tax voted by the electors of said town, at a town meeting held in said town on the 9th day of January, 1865.

When to be collected.

SECTION 2. Said tax shall be collected as soon as practicable, in the manner now provided by law: *provided*, it shall be so collected before the first Monday in March; *and provided*, the amount so raised shall not exceed the sum of two hundred dollars to be paid to each volunteer.

Limit to bounties.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 6.

[Published January 27, 1865.]

AN ACT to authorize the city of Milwaukee to erect a school house in the third ward of said city.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authority to erect school house.

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Milwaukee are hereby authorized to cause to be erected a
