AN AGT to amend section 31 of chapter 112 of the revised statutes, entitled "of guardians and wards."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section thirty-one of chapter one where bond of hundred and twelve of the revised statutes is hereby filed and to be amended, so as to read as follows: "Section 31. and how and where presented."

Every bond given by a guardian shall be filed and recorded in the probate office of the county court of the county, and in case of any breach of the condition thereof, may be prosecuted in the name of the ward for the use and benefit of such ward, or of any person interested in the estate, whenever the judge of the county court shall direct; and all bonds of guardians heretofore filed or recorded in said probate office of the county court of the proper county, shall be held to be as valid for all purposes as if the same had been filed in the office of the clerk of the circuit court of the county."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

AN ACT to authorize the Northern Pacific railroad and telegraph company, incorporated by an act of congress entitled "au act granting lands to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from Lake Superior to Puget's Sound, on the Pacific coast, by the northern route," approved July 2d, 1861, to construct their railroad and telegraph line through the state of Wisconsin.
