

CHAPTER 12.

[Published February 27, 1867.]

AN ACT to provide for the distribution of school moneys in certain cases.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Where the county board of supervisors of any county have at their annual meeting in 1866, estimated and determined the amount of moneys to be raised in each town and ward in their county for the support of common schools therein for such year, which tax has been levied and collected, and was not less than one-half the amount of school moneys apportioned to such town and ward by the state superintendent in his last apportionment of school moneys, the state superintendent shall apportion to each town and ward in such counties for the year 1867, the same amount of school moneys as if such county board of supervisors had complied with the provisions of chapter 40 of the general laws of 1866.

Apportionment of school moneys in certain cases.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 13.

[Published March 2, 1867.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 81 of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to authorize the supreme court to appoint a crier."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 81 of the general laws of 1866 is hereby amended, by adding the following section: "Section 4. There is hereby appropriated from any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, an amount sufficient to pay the fees of the crier authorized by this act to be appointed."
