## CHAPTER 178.

[Published April 22, 1867.]

AN ACT to amend chapter eighty-six of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to amend chapter 95 of the revised statutes, entitled 'of the supreme court.'"

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter eighty-six of the general laws of the year 1867 is hereby amended, by inserting in the first line of said section the words "one hundred and fifteen," in lieu of the words "ninety-five," where they occur in the first line of said section, so that said section when amended will read as follows: "The first section of chapter one hundred and fifteen of the revised statutes, entitled 'of the supreme court,' is hereby amended, so as to read as follows, to-wit: 'There shall be held at Madison, in the supreme court-room, two sessions of the supreme court in each year, to be called the February and the September terms. The February term shall commence on the first Tuesday of February, and the September term shall commence on the second Tuesday of September, of each and every year.'"

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force from and after the third Tuesday in June next, and all writs, process and proceedings made before this act is in force, returnable to the June term of said court, shall be deemed and taken to be returnable to the September term. When to take effect.
