CHAPTER 150.

[Published March 31, 1871.]

AN ACT to appropriate to D. L. Quaw and Paul Schungel, each a sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to D. L. Quaw, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of eighteen dollars in full payment for his mileage and expenses in going to Milwaukee to subpoena witnesses to testify before the committee appointed by the assembly to investigate charges of corruption connected with bill No. 1, assembly, at the session of the legislature for the year 1871. Appropriated to D. L. Quaw.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twelve dollars to Paul Schungel in full payment for his mileage and per diem and expenses in coming from Milwaukee to Madison to testify before the said committee. To Paul Schungel.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
