

## CHAPTER 112.

[Published April 1, 1872.]

AN ACT allowing amendments of complaints and warrants in criminal proceedings before justices of the peace.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

Applicable to criminal proceedings.

SECTION 1. The provisions of sections 27, 28, 29 and 30 of chapter 137 of the laws of 1871, shall be as applicable to all criminal proceedings had before justices of the peace as to courts of record, and justices may allow amendments of complaints and warrants in all cases as may courts of record of indictments or informations.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 113.

[Published April 5, 1872.]

AN ACT to authorize the building of a soldiers' monument in the capitol park.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

Shall appoint board of commissioners.

SECTION 1. For the purpose of erecting a monument to the memory of the Wisconsin soldiers who lost their lives in the war for the preservation of the union, the governor is hereby authorized to appoint a board of commissioners to consist of eleven persons, one from each congressional district and three from the state at large, who shall continue in office until the work committed to their charge is completed, and all vacancies occurring shall be filled by the governor. The monument herein contemplated shall be erected at such point in the capitol park as the governor shall designate, and

shall be paid for by voluntary contributions from the people of this state.

SECTION 2. Said commissioners shall have authority to elect such officers, appoint such committees and agents, and make such by-laws, rules and regulations for the accomplishment of the work entrusted to them, as they shall deem necessary and proper, not inconsistent with the laws of this state. The treasurer they may appoint shall give such bond as the board shall require, and no member of the board, officer, committee or agent shall receive any compensation for his services: *provided*, the board may authorize the payment of a reasonable compensation to a building superintendent, should the same be necessary.

May erect officers, make by-laws, etc.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of commencing the work contemplated by this act, the board of commissioners are hereby authorized to procure, and with the approval of the governor, adopt a plan and specifications for the erection of said monument, which shall be paid for by the governor, and for that purpose there is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of three hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the payment of the plans and specifications adopted as aforesaid.

May adopt plan and specifications.

SECTION 4. The work of erecting said monument shall be carried on under the direction and control of such committee or superintendent as the board of commissioners shall appoint, but the governor shall at all times have such control over the grounds around the same as to direct what part thereof may be used and occupied for building purposes. The work of erecting such monument shall not be commenced until the building fund shall have reached the sum of at least ten thousand dollars.

Direction and control.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
