

CHAPTER 191.

[Published March 23, 1874.]

AN ACT conferring certain powers on the Cedarburgh Fire Company.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. In addition to the powers conferred upon the Cedarburgh Fire Company by chapter 469 of private and local laws of 1867: the foreman or other officer having charge of said company, for the purpose of keeping and enforcing order and guarding and preserving property, shall have further power to order bystanders at the time of fire to help or assist to extinguish the fire or to prevent the same from spreading in such a manner as may seem best to the said officer, and he shall have further all the powers which are by statute conferred upon fire wardens of incorporated villages. Additional powers.

SECTION 2. Any disobedience to the directions of said officers as aforesaid shall be a misdemeanor, and, any and all persons duly convicted thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten (10) dollars, nor less than two (2) dollars, or confined in the county jail of Ozaukee county not exceeding ten (10) days. Penalty for disobedience.

SECTION 3. Any justice of the peace of the county of Ozaukee, shall have jurisdiction in all cases arising under this act.

SECTION 4. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.
