

CHAPTER 304.

AN ACT to authorize John H. Knapp and others to construct and maintain a dam across Moon's Creek (so called) in the county of Barron.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Names of incorporators.

Authorized to construct a dam.

Purposes of construction.

Penalty for injury to dam.

SECTION 1. John H. Knapp, Henry L. Stout, Andrew Tainter, William Wilson, Thomas B. Wilson and John H. Douglass and their associates, successors and assigns are hereby authorized to construct and maintain a dam across Moon's creek in section 16, township No. 33, north of range No. 14, west of 4th meridian in the county of Barron; said dam to be constructed for hydraulic and manufacturing purposes, and for the purpose of facilitating driving logs down said stream: *provided*, said dam shall be upon land owned by them or some of them.

SECTION 2. Any person or persons who shall willfully break or destroy said dam or shall open the same, shall be liable to the proprietors thereof in an action of trespass to the amount of damages done, in addition to the penalties already provided by law, to be recovered before any court of competent jurisdiction.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of Nels Otterson, a justice of the peace in the county of Polk.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Acts of justice of peace legalized.

SECTION 1. The official acts of Nels Otterson, a justice of the peace in the county of Polk, between April 7, 1873, and October 1, 1873, inclusive, are hereby legalized and declared to be valid so far as the same may heretofore have been invalid because of the failure of said Nels Otterson to file his official bonds as such justice of the peace within said time.
