

CHAPTER 125.

[Published March 6, 1875.]

AN ACT to provide for costs on writs of certiorari from justices of the peace.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Costs and state tax.

SECTION 1. At the time of serving writs of certiorari upon a justice of the peace, it shall be the duty of the party in whose favor the writ shall issue, or his attorney, to pay the justice's costs, one dollar for return and one dollar for state tax, which shall be taxed the same way as other costs on determination of case.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 126.

AN ACT to provide for the safe keeping of certain court records in Milwaukee county.

[Published March 6, 1875.]

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Records to be kept in court-house.

SECTION 1. The official records made by the phonographic reporters of the circuit and county courts of Milwaukee county, shall be kept by said reporters in the court house of said county.

Suitable room to be provided for safe keeping of records.

SECTION 2. The county board of Supervisors of Milwaukee county shall assign and furnish suitable rooms in the court house of said county for the safe keeping of the records mentioned in the foregoing section, and for the transaction of all business lawfully connected with the keeping of such records.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
