

CHAPTER 208.

[Published March 11, 1875.]

AN ACT in relation to the Wisconsin Railroad Farm Mortgage Land Company.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Commissioners to furnish list of lands to county clerks.

SECTION 1. Commissioners of the Wisconsin Railroad Farm Mortgage Land Company shall be and are hereby required to furnish a list of all lands held by them in each county in this state, describing each piece by forty-acre lots, or fractional parts thereof, and designating, by description, what lands have been disposed of during the year 1874, to the county clerk of each county in which such lands are located, on or before the first day of April, 1875.

To make annual report of lands sold.

SECTION 2. Said commissioners shall annually, hereafter, report to the county clerk of the county in which such lands are located, what part, if any, of said lands have been sold, describing the same, up to the first day of April in each year.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 209.

[Published March 11, 1875.]

AN ACT to empower and authorize the common council of the city of Ripon to settle its bonded indebtedness by issuing new bonds.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Authority to issue new bonds.

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Ripon is hereby authorized to issue new bonds for readjusting its bonded indebtedness, and retiring all its present outstanding bonds to any amount not exceeding the sum of thirty-seven thousand dollars (\$37,000), on the principal of all the bonds hereto-

fore issued and now outstanding, and not provided for in the tax-levy for the year 1874.

SECTION 2. All bonds issued under this act shall be numbered consecutively, from one upwards, in the order in which they shall issue; each and every bond so to be issued shall show on its face for what purpose the same was issued.

Bonds to be numbered and to show for what purpose issued.

SECTION 3. All bonds issued under this act shall be signed by the mayor and countersigned by the clerk of said city, and shall be sealed with the corporate seal and made payable in the city of New York, and shall be due and payable at a not longer time than five years from the date thereof; each bond shall be for the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500), with interest at a rate of not more than eight per cent., payable semi-annually, and no bond or bonds shall be used or exchanged for any outstanding bond at a less rate than par.

How issued.

Denomination and interest.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 210.

[Published March 19, 1875.]

AN ACT to protect persons engaged in the business of breeding and rearing furred animals.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to pursue, trap, ensnare, or kill any otter, beaver, mink, muskrat, or other fur-bearing animals upon any lands owned by any person or persons engaged in the business of breeding and rearing such animals.

Unlawful to kill furred animals on lands owned by persons breeding same.

SECTION 2. Any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of section one of this act shall, on conviction thereof, be fined not less than five nor more than twenty dollars for each and every offense, to be paid to the owner or owners of the lands upon which the offense was committed.

Penalty for violation.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
