

CHAPTER 283.

AN ACT to repeal chapter three hundred and sixty-six of the private and local laws of the year 1869, entitled, "An act to authorize E. C. Clark to keep and maintain ferries across the bays of Superior and St. Louis and the St. Louis River," approved March ninth, 1869.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter three hundred and sixty-six, of the private and local laws of the year 1869, entitled "An act to authorize E. C. Clark to keep and maintain ferries across the bays of Superior and St. Louis, and the St. Louis river," approved March ninth, 1869, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 284.

[Published March 23, 1875.]

AN ACT in relation to the duties and fees of registers of deeds and other county officers in certain cases.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The register of deeds of each county in this state shall be entitled to ten cents for each folio for entering and recording any deed or other instrument, to be paid when the same is left for record; *provided*, that in no case shall the fees of any such register be less than fifty cents for recording any deed, or less than seventy-five cents for recording any mortgage; *provided*, that whenever the receipts of fees by any register of deeds is less than three hundred dollars per annum, the county board of supervisors shall have the right to vote a salary to said register of deeds not exceeding two hundred dollars.
