

CHAPTER 125.

[Published March 11, 1876.]

AN ACT to appropriate to P. R. Tierney the sum of money therein named.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to P. R. Tierney, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one hundred and forty dollars (\$140), in full compensation for services rendered the state, under the direction of his excellency, William R. Taylor, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, in prosecuting certain offenses growing out of a violation of the provisions of chapter two hundred and seventy-three (273), of the laws of 1874. Appropriation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 126.

[Published March 16, 1876.]

AN ACT to amend section forty (40), of chapter one hundred and nineteen, of the general laws of 1872, entitled, "An act in relation to railroads, and the organization of railroad companies."

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section forty (40), of chapter one hundred and nineteen (119), of the general laws of 1872, entitled, "An act in relation to railroads, and the organization of railroad companies," is hereby amended, so that the first paragraph thereof down to, and including the word "fixtures," shall read as follows, viz: All rolling stock of any railroad company used and employed in connection with its railroad, and all fuel necessary for the operation of the same, shall be, and the same are hereby declared to be fixtures. Amended.
What considered fixtures.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.
