CHAPTER 56.

AN ACT relating to village cemeteries.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Power of trustees.

SECTION 1. The trustees of any incorporated village within the state shall have power to purchase in the name of said village, outside of the limits of said village, suitable grounds to be used exclusive as a village cemetery.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 57.

AN ACT to provide for the construction of a viaduct in the First avenue of the city of Milwaukee.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Power of common council.

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Milwaukee is hereby authorized and instructed to direct and compel the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway Company, at its own expense, to construct and maintain an iron viaduct on First avenue, in said city of Milwaukee, with suitable abutments of masonry; the north face of the southerly abutment to be six feet south of the south rail of the south track of the railway of said railway company, as at present located, crossing said avenue, and the northerly abutment on the north line of Oregon street, on such a grade and plan as may be furnished by the said railway company and approved by said common council: *provided*, that the planking and floor joist of wood for the roadway and sidewalk over said viaduct shall be made and forever maintained at the expense of said city.

Proviso.

Approaches, etc., may be built; how paid for, etc.

SECTION 2. The said common council is hereby authorized and instructed to construct and maintain proper approaches to said viaduct at each end thereof, the costs and expenses of which approaches and their
