CHAPTER 172.

AN ACT to amend chapter four hundred and seven of the private and local laws of 1868, entitled an act to enable the city of Kenosha to readjust and fund its indebtedness.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter four hundred and seven of the private and local laws of the year 1868, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 2. The bonds authorized to be issued by this act shall not be issued until it shall have been satisfactorily ascertained by the common council that the indebtedness of said city can be adjusted and fully settled by such issue to the amount of two hundred thousand dollars. ^{When bonds may be issued.}

SECTION 2. Section three of chapter four hundred and seven of the private and local laws of 1868, is hereby amended by striking out the words "one hundred and twenty," where they occur in the fifth line of said section, and by inserting instead thereof the words "two hundred." ^{Amended.}

SECTION 3. Section four of chapter four hundred and seven of the private and local laws of the year 1868, is hereby amended by striking out the words "the said sum of one hundred and twenty thousand dollars," where they occur in the tenth and eleventh lines of said section. ^{Amended.}

SECTION 4. Section five of said act is hereby amended by striking out the following words: "submit the same to the qualified voters of the localities subject to be assessed to pay the taxes therein provided for, and if a majority of such electors voting on the question at an election called for that purpose by the council, shall decide affirmatively," where the same occur in said section from the third to the seventh lines thereof. ^{Amended.}

SECTION 5. Section eight of said chapter four hundred and seven is hereby repealed. ^{Repealed.}

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
