

nine, who shall hold their office until their successors are appointed, and who shall have power to execute all business of the corporation committed to them by the by-laws of the institution, and who shall also be empowered to commence and carry on suits in the name of the trustees of the university, and no person shall be *ex-officio* a member of said executive committee.

SECTION 2. All parts of the act to which this is amendatory, conflicting with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 17.

AN ACT to appropriate to the Unity Guards a sum of money therein named.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Unity Guards, of Unity, Wisconsin, the sum of three hundred dollars, as armory fund for the year 1881. Also the further sum of five dollars per man for each member of said company duly and regularly inspected at the annual inspection of said company, for the year 1880, as a clothing fund, the same being the amounts that would have been due said company had they been ordered into annual encampment and passed their annual inspection, which they were unable to do from the fact that their armory, uniforms, arms and accoutrements were destroyed by fire July 13, 1881.

To pay Unity Guards for loss of accoutrements.

SECTION 2. The state treasurer is authorized to pay the sums aforesaid, upon the presentation to him of a certificate of the adjutant general, showing the number of men of said company inspected at said inspection of 1880.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
