### CHAPTER 305.

AN ACT to authorize and enable the town of Burnside in the county of Trempealeau and state of Wisconsin, to make a certain loan therein named, and donate the same to the county of Trempealeau, to aid in building a court house.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

May borrow money.

SECTION 1. The town of Burnside, in the county of Trempealeau, and state of Wisconsin, is hereby authorized to make a loan and donate to the county of Trempealeau, for the purpose of aiding in erecting a court house in said town; any sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), which the electors of said town may decide to give; provided that the county seat of said county shall be first located at the village of Independence, in said town of Burnside.

To be submitted to voters at town meetings.

SECTION 2. At the annual town meeting held on the first Tuesday of April, 1884, there shall be submitted to the electors of said town the question of such donation by ballot. The form of the ballot shall be "for the donation" and "against the donation," and if a majority of all the ballots cast on such question be for the donation, then and thereafter, it shall be lawful for the town board to borrow from the trust funds of the state, under the provisions of chapter 167, of the general laws of 1881, such sum of money as may be agreed upon, and donate the same to the county of Trempealeau, to aid in building a court house within the limits of the said village of Independence.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
