CHAPTER 92.

AN ACT to appropriate a certain sum of money for conducting the sugar experiments at the experimental farm.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated for the professor of agriculture in charge of the experimental farm of the state university, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600), to be expended in the manner and for the purpose contemplated by chapter 211, laws of 1881, entitled "an act to encourage the manufacture of syrup and sugar, and for other purposes;" and the disbursement of said money shall be subject to the provisions of said chapter.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 93.

AN ACT to authorize Joseph Mayer to erect and maintain a dam across the Little Eau Pleine river, in the county of Marathon.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Erect a dam.

SECTION 1. Joseph Mayer, his heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to erect, keep up and maintain a dam across the Little Eau Pleine river, on section number thirty-four (34), township number twenty-seven, (27) north, of range number two (2) east, in the county of Marathon, on lands owned by the said Joseph Mayer. Said dam not to exceed five feet in height.

Slides.

SECTION 2. The aforesaid Joseph Mayer, his associates, heirs and assigns, shall build suitable slides in said dam for running logs and timber over the same, and shall keep the same in repair. The same shall be kept open at all times when said creek is at a driving stage, and there are logs or timber to be run over said dam.

Control of dam.

SECTION 3. The control of said dam and slides shall belong to the said Joseph Mayer, his heirs executors administrators or assigns, but subject always
