CHAPTER 189.

AN ACT to confer the powers of court commissioner on the municipal judge of Barron county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The municipal judge of Barron county shall have and may exercise in his county, all the powers and perform all the duties of a court commissioner, as defined in section 2434, of the revised statutes; and every authority granted to, or limitation of the powers of a court commissioner by the laws of Wisconsin, shall be construed to extend to the said municipal judge, acting in such capacity, except when otherwise expressly provided. The official designation of said officer, in matters wherein he shall so act, shall be "Municipal Judge of Barron County."

CHAPTER 190.

AN ACT to provide for public safety in the construction of private and public school-houses, churches, hotels, factories and other manufacturing establishments.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All churches, public and private school-houses, hotels, factories, or other manufacturing establishments, constructed at any time after the passage of this act, shall be so constructed that the doors shall swing outward, or both in and out, as the builders thereof may elect.

Doors to swing outwards.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
