CHAPTER 284.

AN ACT to discontinue a part of a certain state road in the county of Jackson.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All of a certain state road laid out and established under the provisions of chapter 174, of the private and local laws of 1857, entitled, "An act to provide for laying out a state road from Black River Falls to Tomah, in Monroe county," and approved March 3, 1857, and a certified plat of which road as made by a majority of the commissioners and surveyor thereof, is recorded on pages three hundred and twenty-five to three hundred and twenty-nine inclusive, in volume two, record of state roads in the office of the secretary of state, lying and being in the county of Jackson, is hereby discontinued.
