CHAPTER 339.

AN ACT relating to the compensation of physicians and surgeons, in inquests of the dead, and amendatory of section 4870, of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Compensation
for attending
inquests.

SECTION 1. Section 4870, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended, by adding to the end of said section, the following: Such physicians and surgeons, so subpoenaed, shall, instead of witness fees, receive such reasonable compensation as may be allowed by the county board of supervisors, provided, that such additional compensation shall not be less than five dollars for each examination.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 340.

AN ACT to amend chapter 456, private and local laws of 1870, entitled, "An act directing the treasurer, clerk of the board of supervisors and sheriff of the county of Outagamie, to provide a list of lands to be sold for unpaid taxes."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Repealed.

SECTION 1. Chapter 456, private and local laws, of 1870, entitled, "An act directing the treasurer, clerk of the board of supervisors and sheriff of the county of Outagamie to provide a list of lands to be sold for unpaid taxes," and also to publish election notices in the Appleton Volksfreund, and all acts amendatory of said chapter 456, are hereby repealed.
