CHAPTER 133.

AN ACT to provide for laying out highways from points within to points without the boundaries of incorporated villages.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever it shall be deemed necessary to lay out, alter, widen or discontinue a highway upon a line extending from a point within an incorporated village to a point in a town and without the boundaries of such village, the application therefor shall be in duplicate, addressed to the supervisors of the town and the board of trustees of the village, and be signed by at least six freeholders of the town and six freeholders of the village. Thereupon such board of trustees shall appoint three commissioners on the part of the village who shall be duly sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties as such commissioners before entering on the same. Such commissioners and town supervisors shall then give notice and proceed in all respects as provided by section 1273, of the revised statutes, in cases of laying out highways on the line of adjoining towns, and such village shall be in like manner as a town responsible for that part of such highway determined to be made, and kept in repair by the same, and for the share of damages assigned to the same. All proceedings and orders required to be filed and recorded shall be filed and recorded in the office of the village clerk as well as in the office of the town clerk.

Highways may be altered, laid out, etc., from points within to points without incorporated villages, application, how made.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
