CHAPTER 282.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money therein named to the Wisconsin Wool Growers' and Sheep Breeders' Association.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one hundred dollars to the Wisconsin Sheep Breeders' and Wool Growers' Association for the purpose of printing and publishing the annual reports of said association for the years 1887, and 1888.

Appropriation to Wisconsin Sheep Breeders' and Wool Growers' Association for 1887 and 1888.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 283.

AN ACT to amend section 1061, of the revised statutes, relating, "to boards of review."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1061, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding, at the end thereof, the following words, to-wit: "but no person or corporation shall be heard in any action, suit, or proceeding to question the equality of any assessment unless they shall have first made, such objection before the said board of review, and made offer to sustain the same by competent proof. In which case it shall be the duty of the said board to inquire into the fact of such equality.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 284.

AN ACT to provide for the purchase of an additional number of blue books, for the year 1887, and to appropriate money therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation
for purchase of
additional
copies of blue
book, 1887.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated a sum of money sufficient to pay for the blue books ordered to be printed and distributed under joint resolution No. 16, senate not exceeding however the sum of one dollar and ten cents per copy for such books, and the secretary of state is hereby authorized to furnish such blue books and distribute the same as soon as possible after the passage of this act.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
