CHAPTER 87.

AN ACT to authorize the state board of supervision of charitable, reformatory and penal institutions to build or license the building of railway spur tracks.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

State board of supervision authorized to provide for laying spur track to connect state institutions with general lines of railway.

SECTION 1. The state board of supervision of Wisconsin charitable, reformatory and penal institutions is hereby authorized to build, construct and operate, or if said board shall deem it advisable, to grant license to any railway company or corporation to build and operate a spur track over lands belonging to the state, to connect the public institutions under the supervision of said board with a general line of railway, for the purpose of more conveniently and cheaply supplying said institutions; provided, that any license granted in pursuance hereof shall be revocable at the will of the legislature.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 88.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to George Maine in payment of a judgment against the state of Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation to Geo. Maine, \$88.02.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of eighty-eight dollars and

two cents with interest on the same at seven per cent. per annum, from Dec. 1st, 1885, to George Maine, in payment of a judgment held by him against the state of Wisconsin, rendered and docketed in the circuit court of Marathon county, on December 1st, 1885.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 89.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of A. L. Slye, as justice of the peace in Sauk county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The official acts of A. L. Slye, a duly qualified justice of the peace in the first ward of the city of Baraboo, in Sauk county, done by him while keeping his office, in the months of January, February, March, April and May, 1885, in the second ward of said city, are hereby declared to be as legal and valid, to all intents and purposes, as if the said A. L. Slye had kept his office during said months in the first ward of said city.

Legalizing acts of A. L. Slye, a justice of the peace.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
