CHAPTER 17.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the city of Hudson.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 11, of chapter 3, of the charter of the city of Hudson, being chapter 197, of the laws of 1885, is hereby amended by inserting in said section after the word, "act," in the fifth line of said section and before the word, "provided" in said fifth line, the words, "and each of the justices of the peace elected in the city of Hudson is hereby authorized to hold and keep his office and place of business in either of the wards of the city of Hudson." So that the section when amended will read as follows: Section 11. The justices of the peace of said city shall have the jurisdiction and powers vested in justices of the peace by the general laws of this state so far as the same are not inconsistent with the provisions of this act; and each of the justices of the peace elected in the city of Hudson is hereby authorized to hold and keep his office and place of business in either of the wards of the city of Hudson; provided, that when any of said justices of the peace shall act as police justice of said city, he shall sign his name to all papers, processes, writs and proceedings whatever, with the addition, "justice of the peace acting as police justice" and such signing shall be prima facie evidence in all courts of the absence from said city, or inability to act, of said police justice.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
