CHAPTER 317.

AN ACT to fix the time for holding the terms of court in the seventh judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The terms of the circuit court of the seventh judicial circuit shall be as follows: For the county of Lincoln, the first Monday in May, and the first Monday in November; for the county of Marathon, the first Monday in March and the second Monday in October; for the county of Portage, the third Monday in November and the fourth Monday in March; for the county of Waupaca, the third Monday in January and the second Monday in June; for the county of Wausshara, the third Tuesday in April and the last Tuesday in September; for the county of Wood, the fourth Monday in May and the second Monday in December. All laws or parts of laws conflicting with any of the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed so far as they conflict therewith, and no further.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after August 1st, 1889, and no sooner.
