CHAPTER 247.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money for the funeral expenses of the late Senator F. W. Horn, and Assemblyman D. A. Mahoney.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation
to Theodore
Knapstein.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Theodore Knapstein, sergeant-at-arms of the assembly, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of thirteen dollars, for funeral expenses incurred in the funerals of the late senator F. W. Horn, and assemblyman D. A. Mahoney, and paid by him in excess of the amount heretofore appropriated.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
