CHAPTER 162.

AN ACT to permit the building of a free wagon bridge across the Fox river in Marquette county, Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

Location of bridge. SECTION 1. The towns of Buffalo and Moundville in the county of Marquette in the state of Wisconsin, are hereby authorized and empowered to build, construct and maintain a free wagon bridge over and across the Fox river on and along, or near to, the section line between sections five and eight in township fourteen north, of range nine east, in the county of Marquette and state of Wisconsin; and for such purpose may erect piers, drive piles, build embankments and approaches in said river and on the banks thereof, suitable and necessary for the proper construction and maintenance of said bridge, and the enjoyment of the rights hereby granted or intended to be granted; provided, that said bridge shall be provided with a proper and suitable draw or swing so as not to obstruct said river unreasonably for navigable purposes.

Right to amend or repeal reserved. SECTION 2. The right is hereby reserved to the state to alter, amend or repeal any or all the provisions of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
