

shall be punished, for the first offense by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding thirty days, and for the second and each subsequent offense by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than thirty days nor more than six months; that one-half of the fine recovered shall go to the complaining witness; provided, that the provisions hereof shall not apply to the sales of jobbers or manufacturers doing an interstate business with customers outside of this state.

Laws repealed. SECTION 2. Section 4608f of the statutes of 1898 and all other acts or parts of acts in conflict with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1st, 1905.

CHAPTER 83.

AN ACT amendatory of section 1021c of the statutes of 1898, relating to the appointment and term of office of the commissioner of the bureau of labor and industrial statistics.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appointment of Commissioner, term of. SECTION 1. Section 1021c, of the statutes of 1898, is hereby amended, so as to read when amended as follows: Section 1021c. A commissioner of said bureau shall be appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, for the term of *four* years from the first Monday of February in the year of his appointment. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
