**CHAPTER 490.**

AN ACT to amend section 1059 of the statutes, relating to re-assessment of property omitted from the tax roll.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 1059 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 1059. Real or personal property omitted from assessment in any of the three next previous years \* \* \* unless previously re-assessed for the same year or years, shall be entered once additionally for each previous year of such omission, designating each such additional entry as omitted for the year \* \* \* 19.... (giving year of omission) and affixing a just valuation to each entry for a former year as the same should then have been assessed according to his best judgment, and taxes shall be apportioned, and collected on the tax roll for such entry.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

**CHAPTER 491.**

AN ACT to create section 959—59m of the statutes, relating to licenses to plumbers in cities of the fourth class.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 959—59m. Any city of the fourth class, whether incorporated under special charter or existing under general law, may adopt for its government, by a three-fourths vote of all the members of the common council, sections 959—53, 959—55, and 959—58 of the statutes relating to licenses to plumbers. By the provisions of said sections, and when the same shall be adopted, such cities shall be governed by the provisions of said sections.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
