

cated within said Camp Randall as near as possible to the Dayton street entrance thereto.

SECTION 3. Said commission shall provide for, and shall have constructed an appropriate entrance way to said memorial park, upon which said commission shall have placed an inscription befitting the memory of the Wisconsin soldiers who served in the civil war and who camped upon said grounds prior to their departure for the front.

SECTION 4. The said commissioners shall serve without compensation, provided that the necessary expenses incurred by them and each of them in the performance of their duties as such commissioners shall be paid out of moneys appropriated by this act upon presentation to the secretary of state of proper vouchers.

SECTION 5. The said commission shall report in writing to the governor upon the thirty-first day of December in each year and shall make a final report covering the entire work done upon the completion of their labors.

SECTION 6. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act there is appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 568.

AN ACT to compensate the officiating chaplains of the Senate and Assembly, and make an appropriation therefor.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to each clergyman who has or may hereafter officiate as chaplain of the senate and assembly during the session of the legislature for the year 1911, the sum of three dollars for each day of such service, to be paid upon the certificates of the chief clerks of the senate and assembly respectively, showing the amounts to which each such chaplain is entitled.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and passage and publication.
