CHAPTER 531.

AN ACT to appropriate to P. F. Hanson and J. A. Jackson, both of the town of Cady in St. Croix county, and to Fred Tschudy of the town of Jefferson in Green county, certain sums of money therein named.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of seventy-one dollars and twenty-five cents, to P. F. Hanson of the town of Cady in St. Croix county, and the sum of thirty-six dollars and fifty cents to J. A. Jackson, of the town of Cady in St. Croix county, and the sum of forty-five dollars to Fred Tschudy of the town of Jefferson in Green county, said sums to be in full payment of the claims of said P. F. Hanson, said J. A. Jackson, and said Fred Tschudy, against the state, which claims arise out of the slaughter of tubercular cattle, ordered slaughtered by the state veterinarian and condemned under proceedings conducted by police justices in the year 1913, in St. Croix and Green counties.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

AN ACT to amend section 20.70 of the statutes, relating to the republication of general laws by semiweekly newspapers.
