CHAPTER 122.

AN ACT to create section 7 of chapter 241, laws of 1893, relating to the municipal court for Ashland county.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to chapter 241, laws of 1893, a new section to read: Section 7. Said judge shall appoint in writing a clerk of said court, who, before entering upon his duties, shall take and subscribe the oath of office prescribed in the constitution, which appointment and oath shall be filed with the clerk of the circuit court of said county; said clerk shall make and keep the records of said court, and perform all ministerial acts required of him by and under the direction of the judge of said municipal court. Such clerk of said court shall have power to administer oaths to jurors and witnesses on any trial in said court.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 123.

AN ACT to authorize cities to reimburse persons who have been appointed to positions in such cities for expenses incurred in defending in actions of quo warranto.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever in any city, however incorporated, an attempt has heretofore been made by the proper officers, board or council thereof to remove any officer or employe from his position and another person has been appointed to such position in the manner provided by law, and has qualified and assumed to perform the duties of such position, and the person sought to be removed has brought an action of quo warranto against the person appointed to the position and has prevailed in such action, the common council of such city may authorize and provide for the payment to the person appointed to fill the supposed vacancy of such sum as such council sees fit to reimburse such person for the expenses reasonably incurred for costs and attorneys' fees in defending in such action.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
