

otherwise qualified. The oath so taken, on being corroborated as to the residence and tribal relations of such person by the affidavit of a qualified elector, shall be filed in the office of the clerk before whom it was taken and recorded by him in a book to be provided for that purpose, upon such person paying to said clerk the sum of one dollar.

SECTION 2. The question whether the foregoing provisions of this act shall take effect and be in force, shall be submitted to a vote of the people of this state, in the manner provided by law for the submission of an amendment to the constitution at the next general election to be held in November, 1920. If approved by a majority of all the votes cast on that subject at such election, it shall take effect and be in force from and after such approval by the people; otherwise it shall not take effect or be in force. Upon the ballot shall be printed "Shall Chapter----- (insert on the ballot the number of chapter) of the laws of 1919, entitled 'An act extending the right of suffrage to women' be adopted?"

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 121.

AN ACT to amend sections 772—2 and 772—16 of the statutes, relating to civil service in counties having a population of two hundred thousand or more.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections 772—2 and 772—16 of the statutes are amended to read: Section 772—2. Every person appointed a member of said commission shall before entering upon the duties of his office take and subscribe the oath of office prescribed by the constitution of the state. All appointees on said commission shall be legal residents of the county in which they are appointed to act and no person holding any elective or appointive public position or office of any sort in said county government shall be appointed on said civil service commission. Each member of the commission shall receive * * * *such salary as the county board shall determine*, provided, however, that no such member shall receive * * * *less than two hundred dollars for service performed in any one year.* * * * Members of the commission may be removed from office at any time by the county board of supervisors for cause.

Section 772—16. A sufficient sum shall be provided each year by the county board of supervisors of each county in which this act shall become operative to enable the commission created under sections 772—1 to 772—17, inclusive, of the statutes, to exercise the powers and perform the duties therein specified. * * *

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 122.

AN ACT to amend subsection 2 of section 1421—11 of the statutes, relating to occupational therapy in county tuberculosis sanatorium.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 2 of section 1421—11 of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 1421—11) 2. Such trustees shall receive their actual expenses in the performance of their duties and may receive the same compensation for their services as is allowed members of the county board. The trustees shall appoint in all counties, except those counties having a population of over three hundred thousand, as superintendent of such institution a graduate trained nurse, or a regular licensed physician. In case a graduate trained nurse is appointed, the trustee shall also appoint a visiting physician, and may also appoint a business manager, other than the superintendent. *Such trustees shall also appoint and fix the compensation of a director of occupational therapy, who may be employed on a part time basis jointly with other county or state institutions.* The trustees shall fix the compensation of the superintendent and visiting physician and business manager, if any; and shall designate the number of employes of such institution, and fix their compensation. In counties having a population of more than three hundred thousand the trustees shall appoint a medical superintendent and fix his compensation. The trustees shall designate the number of employes of such institution and fix the compensation of such employes. The employes shall be selected by the superintendent, subject to the confirmation of the board of trustees.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
