CHAPTER 644.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money named therein to Ellen M. Bowers for injuries received at the state fairgrounds in September, 1910.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund to Ellen M. Bowers, the sum of three thousand dollars, for injuries received by her while attending the state fair, held at the state fair grounds, in September, 1910; provided that this appropriation shall be in full of all claims of said Ellen M. Bowers against the state in connection with said accident.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 645.

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 376, laws of 1919, entitled "An Act to appropriate One Thousand dollars for the special committee created by joint resolution No. 29, S., to investigate the methods of doing business in this state by the International Harvester Company.

SECTION 1. Chapter 376, laws of 1919, is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 646.

AN ACT to amend subsection (5) of section 40.47 of the statutes, relating to establishment of union free high schools; and to validate action heretofore taken in the creation of union free high schools.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (5) of section 40.47 is amended to read: (40.47) (5) In all cases the vote shall be by ballot, and the ballots shall be written or printed "For Union Free High
