CHAPTER 470.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum herein named to John G. Schwartz of Hazelhurst to reimburse him for the cost of timber purchased from the state and which was wrongfully destroyed. *The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund to John G. Schwartz of Hazelhurst the sum of five hundred and twenty-five dollars, to reimburse him for the cost of timber purchased from the state and which was wrongfully destroyed by one Conrad Gloeckner, after assurances by agents of the state that in the event of such an occurrence he would be reimbursed the purchase money. Acceptance of this appropriation shall operate as a full and complete discharge of this claim.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 471.

AN ACT to create subsection (1a) of section 72.04 of the statutes, relating to exemptions from inheritance taxes. *The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 72.04 of the statutes to read: 72.04 (1a) All property transferred to any corporation, organization, association or foundation of this state, in trust, and for the direct financial benefit of any town, city, school district, village or county of this state.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
