

make deposit and payment out of the general fund to any city or incorporated village in said county or in an adjoining county to secure and pay for fire department service in said town, and for the prevention and extinguishment of fires as may be necessary and proper, and in connection therewith may contract for or purchase fire extinguishing apparatus which may be housed in such city or village and may be manned by its fire department.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 59.

AN ACT to officially name a lake in Burnett county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The lake in sections 14 and 23, township 41 north, range 14 west, in Burnett county, heretofore unofficially known as the Frog lake, is hereby given the name, Lake Prinel, and shall be so designated in all maps and official documents of this state.

CHAPTER 60.

AN ACT to amend subsection (2) of section 195.11 of the statutes, relating to discrimination by railroads.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (2) of section 195.11 of the statutes is amended to read: (195.11) (2) It shall be unlawful for any railroad to demand, charge, collect or receive from any shipper a less compensation for the transportation of property or for any service rendered or to be rendered by said railroad, in consideration of said shipper furnishing any part of the facilities incident thereto; but any railroad may rent any facilities incident to transpor-

tation and pay a reasonable rental therefor, *but no payment shall be made by any carrier to an industry for performing any part of the service incident to the origination or determination of car load line haul shipments which the carriers have assumed to perform under the provisions of the bill of lading.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 61.

AN ACT to create subsection (5) of section 1.035 of the statutes, relating to the establishment of fish hatcheries by the United States government in Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 1.035 of the statutes to read: (1.035) (5) Subject to the conditions specified in section 1.02, the United States commissioner of fisheries may establish fish hatcheries within Wisconsin and may take fish or fish eggs from the waters of this state for propagation in such hatcheries. The United States commissioner of fisheries and his duly authorized agents are hereby authorized to conduct fish culture operations, rescue work, and all fishing and other operations necessary therefor in connection with such hatcheries in such manner and at such times as is considered necessary and proper by the said commissioner and his agents.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 62.

AN ACT to amend paragraph (e) of subsection (10) of section 85.08 of the statutes, relating to the revocation of drivers' licenses upon nonpayment of judgments for motor vehicle accidents.
