**CHAPTER 270.**

AN ACT to amend subsection (11) of section 70.11 of the statutes, relating to the exemption of radio and phonographs from taxation.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Subsection (11) of section 70.11 of the statutes is amended to read: (70.11) (11) Wearing apparel, personal ornaments and jewelry habitually worn not exceeding in value seven hundred fifty dollars, family portraits, private libraries, not exceeding in value two hundred dollars, kitchen and other household furniture and furnishings, one piano, *radio or phonographs*, organ or melodeon and other musical instruments, and also growing crops, including ginseng and other medicinal plants.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

**CHAPTER 271.**

AN ACT to amend paragraph (a) and to create paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 62.24 of the statutes, relating to the jurisdiction of a police justice.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 62.24 of the statutes is amended to read: (62.24) (2) (a) The police justice shall have the jurisdiction of a justice of the peace \* \* \* and exclusive jurisdiction of offenses against ordinances of the city.

SECTION 2. A new paragraph is added to subsection (2) of section 62.24 of the statutes to read: (62.24) (2) (b) No justice of the peace, except in cities of the fourth class, shall have criminal jurisdiction of offenses committed in the city, nor power to issue warrant for, examine, commit or hold to bail any person charged with an offense therein.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
