CHAPTER 481.

AN ACT to create section 23a of chapter 38, laws of 1895, relating to municipal courts of Bayfield county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new section is added to chapter 38, laws of 1895, to read: (Chapter 38, laws of 1895) Section 23a. The county board of Bayfield county by resolution adopted by a majority of its elected members, at a regular meeting, may abolish said municipal court and may transfer the jurisdiction thereof to the county court of Bayfield county. In the event the jurisdiction of said municipal court is so transferred, the provisions of this chapter relating to the municipal court shall apply to the court in so far as applicable.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 482.

AN ACT to amend paragraph (b) of subsection (5) of section 67.05 of the statutes, relating to bonding by municipalities.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (5) of section 67.05 of the statutes is amended to read: (67.05) (5) (b) (as amended in chapter 118, laws of 1933) No city shall issue any bonds for any purposes other than *for the purposes specified in subsection (9) of section 67.04*, for replacing sums expended for emergency relief purposes during the years 1929 to 1933, inclusive, waterworks, lighting works, gasworks, bridges, street improvements, street improvement funding, hospitals, harbor improvements, river improvements, breakwaters and protection piers, sewerage, parks and public grounds, street railway property, or paying the city's portion of the cost of abolishing grade crossings, for the purchase of sites for engine houses, for fire engines and other equipment of the fire department, for construction of engine houses, and for pumps, water mains, reservoirs and all other reasonable facilities for fire protection, apparatus or equipment
