JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to a memorial to the late Senator Robert M. LaFollette.

WHEREAS, The legislature of 1925 created an interim committee to make recommendations to the legislature on a suitable memorial to the late Senator Robert M. LaFollette, which committee has been continued since by each successive legislature; and

WHEREAS, There has long been under contemplation a project for building a new library building at the university to house all of the several libraries now located on the campus, which project is one for which provision will have to be made within the next few years; and

WHEREAS, A most suitable memorial to the late Senator Robert M. LaFollette would be to designate this library, when erected, as the LaFollette Memorial Library; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring, That as a memorial to the late Senator Robert M. LaFollette the new library at the University of Wisconsin, when erected, shall be known as the LaFollette Memorial Library.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Requesting the President of the United States to increase the grants for highway improvement in the several states under the National Industrial Recovery Act.

WHEREAS, Under the National Industrial Recovery Act the President is authorized to make grants to the highway departments of the several states in an amount not less than four hundred million dollars; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to such authority, the President has authorized such grant of four hundred million dollars, under which the allotment to Wisconsin is less than ten million dollars; and

WHEREAS, The highway commission of Wisconsin has received requests from political subdivisions of this state for needed high-

way improvements on worthy projects aggregating in excess of seventy million dollars, or eight times the allotment to Wisconsin under the grant authorized; and

WHEREAS, The highway departments of other states are undoubtedly confronted with the same problem; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring. That the President of the United States be, and he is hereby, respectfully requested and urged, pursuant to the authority vested in him, to increase the grants to the highway departments of the several states to an amount aggregating at least eight hundred million dollars, so that Wisconsin and the other states may more adequately meet the requests for necessary and worthy highway improvement projects; and be it further

Resolved, That a properly attested copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Honorable Franklin D. Roosevelt, President of the United States.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to the Wisconsin Memorial Hospital

WHEREAS, The Wisconsin Memorial Hospital was erected for the care and cure of veterans of the World War suffering from mental and nervous disorders and is a peculiarly well-equipped institution for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, The usefulness of this institution has been largely destroyed by the action of the federal government in removing from this hospital the great majority of the patients, as a part of the federal economy program; and

WHEREAS, This action not only leaves the state of Wisconsin with an institution which no longer can serve the purpose for which it was erected but also is very unfair to the unfortunate veterans and their relatives, most of whom are residents of Wisconsin; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring, That the Legislature of Wisconsin respectfully memorializes the President of the United States and the veterans' administration to return to the Wisconsin Memorial Hospital the patients who were re-
