CHAPTER 318.

AN ACT to create 363.02 (10) of the statutes, relating to the purposes for which search warrants may be issued.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

363.02 (10) of the statutes is created to read:

363.02 (10) To search for and seize any instrument or other article which has been used in the commission of, or may constitute evidence of, a crime.

CHAPTER 319.

AN ACT to amend chapter 295, laws of 1941, relating to the examination and commitment of persons who are insane or feeble-minded either at the time of the commission of an offense or at the time of trial.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Chapter 295, laws of 1941, is amended to read:

Chapter 295, laws of 1941. There is conferred upon the judge of the district court in any county having a district court which is a court of record, all of the powers with respect to the examination of persons alleged to be insane or feeble-minded either at the time of the commission of an offense properly within the jurisdiction of said district court or at the time of trial thereof, as provided by sections 357.11 and 357.13 of the statutes, except that persons charged merely with the violation of local ordinances and found insane shall be committed to the county hospital for the insane in all counties where such a hospital exists, otherwise to such institution as the state department of public welfare may direct.
