### CHAPTER 10.

AN ACT to create 46.06 (12) and 20.17 (1) (f) of the statutes, relating to disposal of lands at the Wisconsin industrial home for women, the purchase of new lands, and making an appropriation.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 46.06 (12) of the statutes is created to read:

46.06 (12) Subject to the approval of the emergency board, the state department of public welfare may sell and convey a tract of land situated in the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section 6, township 15 north, range 18 east, and more particularly described as follows in accordance with a survey of part of sections five (5) and six (6) made by county surveyor George W. Marshall in March and April of 1914 and a map of said survey which is recorded in volume seven (7) of plats on page four (4) in the office of the register of deeds of Fond du Lac county:

Commencing at an iron stake set at the north east corner of said section six (6) and running thence south along the section line eight hundred ten and fifty two/one hundredths feet (810.52 ft.) to a point five (5) chains and 78 links, said distance being equal to three hundred eighty-one and forty-eight/one hundredths feet (381.48 ft.), north of the east quarter quarter ( $E\frac{1}{4}\frac{1}{4}$ ) post of said north east quarter ( $NE\frac{1}{4}$ ), said post being set by proportional U. S. government distances one thousand and two hundred ninety-three and four/tenths feet (1293.40 ft.) north of the east quarter ( $E\frac{1}{4}$ ) post and eleven hundred ninety-two feet (1192 ft.) south of the north east corner of said section six (6); thence west parallel with the south line of said north east quarter of the north east quarter ( $NE\frac{1}{4}NE\frac{1}{4}$ ) and along the north line of the tract formerly owned by Paul Hauser and

Louis Scheffler (see volume 50 of deeds, page 232) about two hundred feet (200 ft.) to the center of the Sheboygan and Taycheedah plank road, now commonly called the ledge road; thence northerly along the center line of said ledge road to the north line of said section six (6); thence east on section line one hundred sixteen (116) feet to the place of beginning, and containing four acres of land more or less, and being a corrected description of the same land deed by Richard P. Kunaschk and wife to E. H. Cameron and F. S. Cameron his wife by deed recorded in volume 164 of deeds on page 69, and a tract of land situated in the northwest quarter of section 5, township 15 north, range 18 east, and more particularly known and described as follows:

Commencing at the north west corner of said section five (5) and running thence south along the west line of said section eleven hundred ninety-one and five/hundredths (1191.05) feet to the west quarter quarter ( $W\frac{1}{4}\frac{1}{4}$ ) post of said north west quarter ( $NW\frac{1}{4}$ ), said post being twelve hundred ninety-two and thirty-five/one hundredths (1292.35) feet north of the west quarter post of said section five (5), thence northerly to a point on the north line of section five (5) which is three hundred sixty-five and five/tenths (365.50) feet east of the north west corner of section five (5); thence west along section line three hundred sixty-five and five/tenths (365.50) feet to the place of beginning and containing five (5) acres of land more or less, all in accordance with a survey of part of sections five (5) and six (6) of said township and range made by county surveyor George W. Marshall in March and April of 1914, a map of said survey being recorded in the office of the register of deeds for Fond du Lac county in volume seven (7) of plats on page four (4), both tracts being a part of the Wisconsin industrial home for women property located in Fond du Lac county. The proceeds of such sale or sales shall be paid into the general fund and made available for use of the department for acquisition of new lands suitable for the production of food for institutions or for other capital purposes, or both, as provided in section 20.17 (1) (f).

SECTION 2. 20.17 (1) (f) of the statutes is created to read:

20.17 (1) (f) The proceeds of the sale of certain lands at the home for women at Taycheedah under the provisions of section 46.06 (12) for the acquisition of new farming lands, or other capital expenditures or both.
