city, village or town by reason of such closing, provided that if such closing shall leave any part of such street, highway, parkway or alley without access to another public street or highway, the county, town, city or village effecting such closing shall immediately provide such access at its expense.

Section 3. 114.136 (6) of the statutes is repealed.

## CHAPTER 517.

AN ACT to renumber 40.16 (14) to be 40.16 (14) (a) and to create 40.16 (14) (b), (c) and (d) and 40.53 (17) of the statutes, relating to health examinations for school employes and school children.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senote and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 40.16 (14) of the statutes is renumbered 40.16 (14) (a).

Section 2. 40.16 (14) (b), (c) and (d) are created to read: 40.16 (14) (b) The school district board of districts in counties containing less than 500,000 population, may, as a condition of employment, require periodic health examinations of all school employes. If such examinations are ordered, they shall be required of every school employe of the district except those objecting thereto on religious grounds. No employe shall be discriminated against for raising such objection unless there is reasonable cause to believe that he is infected with a communicable disease. The cost of such examinations, including x-rays, shall be paid out of district funds. The employe may be examined by any licensed physician selected by the employe. Such physician shall make confidential a report of such examination and chest x-rays on a standard form to be prepared by the state board of health to a licensed physician employed by the board of education, who shall make recommendations therefrom to the board and to the employe.

(c) For the purpose of paragraph (b) a "school employe" is defined as anyone employed by the board of education of the school district who comes in contact with children or who handles

or prepares food for children while they are under the superivision of school authorities.

(d) The school district board of districts in counties containing less than 500,000 population, may require periodic health examinations of school children, by licensed physicians, under supervision of local and state boards of health, and may pay the cost of such examinations out of district funds.

SECTION 3. 40.53 (17) of the statutes is created to read:

40.53 (17) To provide for periodic health examinations for school employes and school children as specified in section 40.16 (14) (b), (e) and (d).

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## CHAPTER 518.

AN ACT to repeal 20.491 (5), to amend 20.49 (introductory paragraph) and (9) (a), and to create 20.49 (11) of the statutes, relating to the state highway fund and state trunk highway allotment, providing for the addition of certain highways to the state trunk highway system, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 20.491 (5) of the statutes is repealed.

Section 2. 20.49 (introductory paragraph) and (9) (a) of the statutes are amended to read:

20.49 (introductory paragraph) There is appropriated to the state highway commission as received in the state highway fund the surplus of the motor vehicle registration fees, operator's license fees, motor vehicle fuel taxes, and motor carrier fees and taxes, after deducting the actual costs of administration paid from the appropriations made by sections 20.052, 20.091 and 20.511, \* \* \*. The amount thereof collected in each fiscal year and appropriated by this section shall be apportioned and allotted by the commission in the amounts and on the dates hereinafter provided; and if no date is specified, then at such time or times during such fiscal year as the commission may determine.
