**CHAPTER 72.**

AN ACT to amend 38.07 (6) of the statutes, relating to public schools in cities of the first class.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

38.07 (6) of the statutes is amended to read:

38.07 (6) The board has power, subject to the powers and regulations of the city service commission, to employ \* \* \* *school engineers and janitorial assistants \* \* \* necessary \* \* \* for the school buildings and grounds of its city* and to fix their compensation \* \* \*. The principal \* \* \* shall be custodian of all \* \* \* *school premises over which he presides and shall have the general supervision \* \* \* thereof. The duties and responsibilities of the principal as custodian of the building and those of the school engineer shall be as fixed by the board.*

**CHAPTER 73.**

AN ACT to amend 29.147 (1) of the statutes, relating to sportsmen's licenses.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

29.147 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.147 (1) Sportsmen's licenses shall be issued by the state conservation commission or its authorized agents to any resident of this state over the age of 15 years and being a citizen of the United States duly applying therefor and paying a license fee as herein prescribed. The minimum fee for each such sportsmen's license is \$5, but any applicant, at his option, may pay an additional or greater fee therefor. Licenses \* \* \* shall be issued as of \* \* \* August 31 in each year and expire one year from the date of issue. *The expiration date of all sportsmen's licenses of current series issued as of April 30 under the provisions of chapter 196, laws of 1943, is extended*
