CHAPTER 127.

AN ACT to repeal and recreate 135.04 (2) of the statutes, relating to the state board of accountancy.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

135.04 (2) of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

135.04 (2) No certificate as a certified public accountant shall be granted to any person other than a citizen of the United States, or person who has in good faith declared his intention of becoming such a citizen, who is over the age of 23 years and of good moral character, and (except as provided in section 135.05) who has successfully passed a written examination in such subjects affecting accountancy as the board may deem necessary, and who has satisfied the experience requirements provided for in this section. The board, in its discretion, may supplement said written examination by an oral examination and may use the examination service provided by the American Institute of Accountants or such other institute or association of accountants as the board may, in its discretion determine.
