CHAPTER 236

AN ACT to amend 59.96 (6) (i) of the statutes; and to create section 5 (h) 2. c of chapter 608, laws of 1913, relating to the establishment of rules and regulations of the metropolitan sewerage commission and the enforcement thereof.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 59.96 (6) (i) of the statutes is amended to read:

59.96 (6) (i) Whenever necessary in order to promote the best results from the construction, operation and maintenance of the systems provided for in this section, and to prevent damage to the same from misuse, the commission, acting on behalf of the district, may make, promulgate and enforce such reasonable rules and regulations for the supervision, protection, management and use of said system as it * * * *deems* expedient, and such regulations shall prescribe the manner in which connections to main sewers and intercepting sewers shall be made, and may prohibit discharge into such sewers, of any liquid or solid waste deemed detrimental to the sewerage system herein provided for. Such rules and regulations shall be adopted and enforced as provided by chapter 336, laws of 1957. *Notwithstanding any other provision of law, such rules and regulations, or any special orders issued thereunder, may be enforced under s. 280.02*

and the violation of any rule or regulation or any special order lawfully promulgated by said commission is hereby, in the discretion of the court declared to be a public nuisance.

SECTION 2. Section 5 (h) 2. c of chapter 608, laws of 1913, is created to read:

(Chapter 608, laws of 1913) Section 5 (h) 2. c. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, such rules and regulations, or any special orders issued thereunder, may be enforced under section 280.02 of the statutes, and the violation of any rule or regulation or any special order lawfully promulgated by said commission is hereby, in the discretion of the court declared to be a public nuisance.
